**First Lady to head Norman foundation**

NORMAN (AP) — First Lady Kim Henry has been named the new executive director of the Norman-based Sarkeys Foundation. The private foundation announced Wednesday that Henry will succeed Cheri Cartwright, the long-time executive director who died earlier this year.

A former teacher, Henry has served on the Sarkeys Board of Trustees since 2003. A statement released by the board says Henry's leadership and administrative skills will help move the foundation forward.

The foundation is dedicated to improving the quality of life in Oklahoma by supporting the work of non-profit agencies across the state.

Founded in 1962 by S.J. Sarkeys, the foundation currently claims assets of around \$100 million and has awarded more than \$55 million in grants.

**OKC woman charged in deadly hit and run**

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — A woman accused in a deadly hit-and-run accident in Oklahoma City has been charged with second-degree murder.








Prosecutors on Tuesday also charged 28-year-old Shannon Rose Delaware of Oklahoma City with leaving the scene of a deadly accident and driving with a suspended license.

Prosecutors allege Delaware was driving a Chevrolet Monte Carlo May 11 that struck 45-year-old Terry Garner at an intersection on the city's south side. Garner died later at the hospital.

After the crash, Delaware was arrested about a mile from the accident scene.

Court records do not indicate if Delaware has retained an attorney.

**SB 602**  
**Summary:** This bill prohibits those convicted of certain felonies to obtain real estate licenses.  
**Vote:** Governor signed

**Summary:** This bill changes the Unfair Claims Settlement Practices Act to include insurance companies failing to pay or requesting a refund for preauthorized health care services.  
**Vote:** Governor signed

**Our take:** A newspaper investigation in Florida found that thousands of mortgage professionals had criminal records, likely contributing to the housing bust there. This law helps Oklahoma homebuyers trust their real estate agents and know they're not being scammed.

**Our take:** We take issue not with this bill but with what this bill could have been. Sen. Kenneth Corn, D-Howe, amended the bill to prohibit insurance companies from paying bonuses to employees who deny care. Although 44 senators voted to adopt the Corn Amendment, a handful of legislators stripped it, without accountability. Who could honestly argue that insurance companies should be able to reward employees for letting policyholders die? The fate of this no-brainer is yet another example of the power of the insurance lobby in our state.

**HJR 1014**  
**Summary:** This resolution proposes a constitutional amendment to prohibit the Legislature from

making expenditures using a predetermined formula or by referencing expenditure levels of other state agencies.  
**Vote:** Doesn't require the governor's signature

**Our take:** If this sounds arcane, step back. What's really driving this resolution is the Oklahoma Education Association petition to increase school funding. HJR 1014 would supersede the petition. Let the people decide whether to support the school-funding proposal on its merits. If Oklahomans don't want it, they'll vote it down.

TRAVEL ADVISORIES

The projects below are all weather permitting: Drivers are asked to remain cautious as work continues on northbound and southbound Broadway Ext. between 122nd St. and Memorial Rd. and Kelley Ave. remains closed north of Memorial Rd. through the fall.

Eastbound and westbound Covell Rd. is closed between Broadway Ave. and Thomas Dr., and northbound and southbound Boulevard is closed between Covell Rd. and Coffee Creek Rd. until late 2009 for surface work and railroad overpass construction.

East and westbound I-44 will be narrowed to one lane in various locations between I-240 and the H.E. Bailey Turnpike nightly from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Sunday through Saturday mornings through early fall.

Motorists should expect various lane closures on northbound and southbound Lake Hefner Parkway (S.H. 74) between N.W. 50th St. and Memorial Rd. nightly from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Monday through Thursday morning for striping. Ramps will remain open.

I-44 will be narrowed to one lane in each direction between N.W. 50th St. and the I-40 junction nightly from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. through June for surface repairs. In addition, the eastbound and westbound I-44 on-ramps from N.W. 23rd St are closed during these times.

As part of ongoing improvements to I-35 in Norman, the following are affected:

- The southbound I-35 off-ramp to southbound U.S. 77 (Flood Ave.) is closed until early August for bridge replacement. The northbound on-ramp from U.S. 77 is open.
- The southbound I-35 off-ramp to westbound Robinson St. in Norman is closed through June. Motorists are still able to access east and westbound Robinson St. using the eastbound off-ramp.

Lanes closed on city streets with ongoing Crosstown construction through 2012:

- Shartel Ave. is permanently closed between S. 7th St. and S. 9th St. Use Walker, Reno or SW 25th.
- Western Ave. is closed between Reno Ave. and Wheeler Park. Detour is Walker Ave. Access to Wheeler Park will be maintained via Walker Ave./S.W. 11th St. throughout the project.
- Pennsylvania Ave. is closed between Reno Ave. and Exchange Ave. until late 2009.
- The westbound off-ramp to May Ave. is permanently closed.
- S.W. 5th St. is closed at Western Ave.
- S.W. 7th St. is closed between S. Broadway Ave. and Santa Fe Ave. until further notice.
